Mutual Respect and Tolerance of those with different faiths

As part of our Primary Curriculum we look at British Values and these include Mutual Respect and Tolerance of those with different faiths. This is a unit of work that we are focusing on, particularly with our Key Stage 2 children at the moment. We have been very fortunate to secure two trips, that will help our children experience this in ways that a classroom simply can not provide. Firstly, Class 4 have been invited to the Bridgewater Hall next week to take part in 'One Voice' concert, celebrating diversity and learning more about different faiths through music.

Our second planned event is for the whole of keystage 2 later in June (letter will follow) to visit Halifax Minster and listen to a talk that will compare the similarities between Christinaity and Islam provided by a former Primary Headteacher who is now the Education Officer at the Minster. This opportunity has been provided free of charge, thanks to the generosity of the Waterhouse Trust.

As a school we are so proud of the respect children show each other on the daily basis and this is something that Ofsted commented on during their most recent inspection. Participating in events such as these not only maintains this level of importance on our British Values but also educates our children further to become model citizens of the future. We are so grateful for the support that families have shown towards these ventures so far.
