
On Tuesday when a lady called Cath Ford, who is an artist came in to our school. She came in with her art student Faye and we looked at the theme of considerate existence.

Cath told us that we were learning about an artist called Annahata Katkin. She was inspired by textured wallpaper and coloured paper. Cath put us in groups of 5 and we looked at some of Anna's pieces of art, she did paint and collage in her pictures. Cath's assistant Faye gave us a picture of a child's face. We cut out some pieces of wallpaper and stuck it on 1m piece of paper. We then sprayed watery paint on top of the piece of paper. Cath said that we had to cover the whole piece of paper by spraying it with 2 colours and then pick a colour to go on top. Then when it had dried, we cut out some colourful paper and made a pattern before we glued everything down. We finished off the lesson by trying to remember the artists name, which was Annahata Khatin.

We really enjoyed our day and we learned how to make collage and add layers to make a fantastic piece of art.
