### READING WORKSHOP FOR EYFS AND KS1 PARENTS WEDNESDAY 7TH FEBRUARY



You are very welcome to come and listen to a short talk from our reading lead Mr Carr, accompanied by class teachers Mrs Mc Mahon and Miss Ashraf, about the way that we teach your child to read at school and the impact this has on the progress they can make during their first few years at Primary School.

There will be coffee and cakes available from 08:40am and the talk will start at 08:50am (lasting no longer than 20mins). There are no planned activities for you to carry out in the workshop, it is simply about listening, to understand more fully how we can work together to best support your child. There will be an opportunity for any questions to be asked on a 1:1 basis following the talk should you wish to stay a little longer.

#### ATTENDANCE

#### 'Moments Matter, Attendance Counts'

Attendance at school is as much about pupil well-being as academic success. Being in school supports pupil's friendships, confidence and wider development. When pupils miss school, the impact of 'feeling behind' can be a barrier to their future success. Government data shows that 84% of Key Stage 2 pupils who had 100% attendance achieved the expected standard, compared to 40% of pupils who were persistently absent across the key stage. If pupils are not in school, we can not support them to learn.
