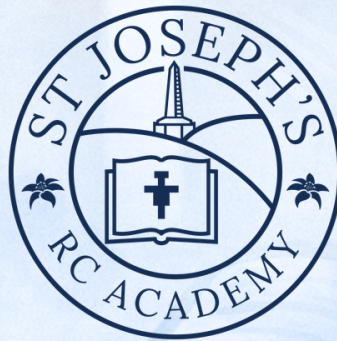

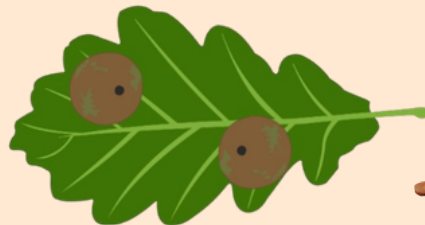

This week at...

Oak Apples Forest School



This week, all classes took part in engaging, hands-on Forest School sessions filled with exploration and discovery.

Beech and Cedar

This week, Beech and Cedar explored superheroes and magical powers. The children made superhero wristbands using masking tape and natural materials, choosing items to represent powers such as flying, invisibility and super strength. They enjoyed sharing their ideas, acting out their powers, building dens, making homes for Barnaby the bee and creating artwork using flowers, dandelions and charcoal.

Elm Class

Elm Class worked hard in the vegetable garden. The children identified vegetables and weeds, discussed what plants need to grow, and helped plant tomatoes, beans, peas, carrots and purple broccoli. Two children were chosen as special plant waterers to help care for the plants each day.

Oak Class

Oak Class created signs for the vegetable garden. After learning how to use tools safely, the children whittled sticks, labelled the vegetables and placed the signs into the soil. They also talked about how to protect the vegetable beds and celebrated their teamwork.
