Peace Sunday 19th January 2020: Peace as a Journey of Hope

Pax Christi is a Catholic worldwide peace movement that promotes peace, respect of human rights, justice & reconciliation throughout the world. Every year, Pax Christi promotes the Holy Father's World Peace Day, on the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, this Sunday. In School, we are promoting this message both through our whole school collective worship, led by the Pupil Chaplains and through our lunchtime para liturgies. As a school community we are working together to value peace as 'a great and precious gift, the object of our hope and the aspiration of the entire human family'.

Pupils are being led in prayer by our pupil chaplains to pray a litany of the Most Holy Name of Jesus in small groups throughout the month of January.

Important Kit Reminder
