'Laudato Si' translated means 'Praise Be to You' and were words used originally by St Francis of Assisi, but have recently been better known as the title of the letter written by Pope Francis, inviting us all to take greater care of our common home and develop a universal awareness of the needs of our planet. Pope Francis calls us all to Live Wisely, Think Deeply and Love Generously. Uniform Consultation — postponed




